






Program Completion at Time of Commission Hearing







150% of Fixed Time Served for all Offenders at Time of Commisison Hearing




Drug & Property Offenders Parole Eligible on Commitment




150% of Fixed Time Served for Drug & Property Offenders at Time of Commission Hearing




Drug & Property Offenders Over 150% of Fixed Time at Commission Hearing 2015




Drug & Property Offenders Identified as Parole Violators on Current Commitment 2015




Frequency of Denial Reasons




4% of Offenders Refusing Parole in 2014 & 2015




Parole Hearing Investigators Recommendation by Crime Type 2015










Revocations by Gender 2015




The youngest offender was 21 years of age, and the oldest was 71. Average age 37.




2015 VIOLATIONS BY TYPE




